Where our passions meet needs ...

I am unable to give credit where it is due for my two favorite statements on missions. I came across them at different times in my studies and readings. While they have stuck with me, the authors, regrettably, have not. The first is "Missions is the price we pay for taking up space on this earth." The second is "Missions is where *your passions* meet the *needs of the world*" (or your neighborhood)! Both statements reflect the gratitude and joy that we experience as we offer ourselves, our gifts and our resources to address those needs that not only pull on our heartstrings, but also nourish our souls.

Over the Season of Lent, we expressed our appreciation and support for those who are passionate about prison ministry, particularly the MATCH program (Mothers and their Children). Through our Giving Tree emphasis, the Saint Luke congregation responded with generosity and grace, donating \$1405 in checks and gift cards to this worthy endeavor. One of the MATCH volunteers, Lisa Wells (pictured at right), attended the 9 am service on April 28 to receive our gifts. Unfortunately, we did not have confirmation that a volunteer would be present so we were unable to introduce her or offer her a moment to share her experience with MATCH. In speaking with her following the service, however, I learned that she is engaged in several ministry efforts that support women who are imprisoned. We give thanks for her and for the other volunteers who seek to enrich the lives of the women and children they serve. It was our joy and privilege to participate in this ongoing effort to strengthen separated families during a time of tremendous duress.



As a reminder, the MATCH program creates space and opportunity for incarcerated mothers to nourish the bonds they have with the children they must leave in the care of others—sometimes with family or friends; sometimes in foster care. Your donations will help fund the travel expenses of volunteers who transport children to and from the Women's Prison in Raleigh for a three hour visit with their mothers—all in a home-like setting within the prison. They also will help fund activities the families may do together, such as celebrating a birthday, playing games or putting together a simple meal—normal activities that we take for granted.

Only mothers who have sentences of seven years or more and who meet certain criteria are invited to participate in this program. It has been shown that both mothers and children fare better when they are able to interact with each other in a more relaxed setting within the prison. While it is true that the release date of some mothers may be far into the future, there will be others who will be released and reunited with their children while they are still young. Much can change in a few years, so it is critical that mothers and children be able to maintain their bonds in a safe and affirming environment.

The living trees in the Williams Lobby and in the Perry Foyer that sprouted purple leaves signifying your donations throughout Lent have been planted around the pond. While one flourished, the other did not. A smaller tree has been planted in its place. As the trees grow and give shade around the pond, may they remind us of the myriad of ways that the Spirit invites us to respond joyfully to the gift of life by matching our passions with the world's needs.
